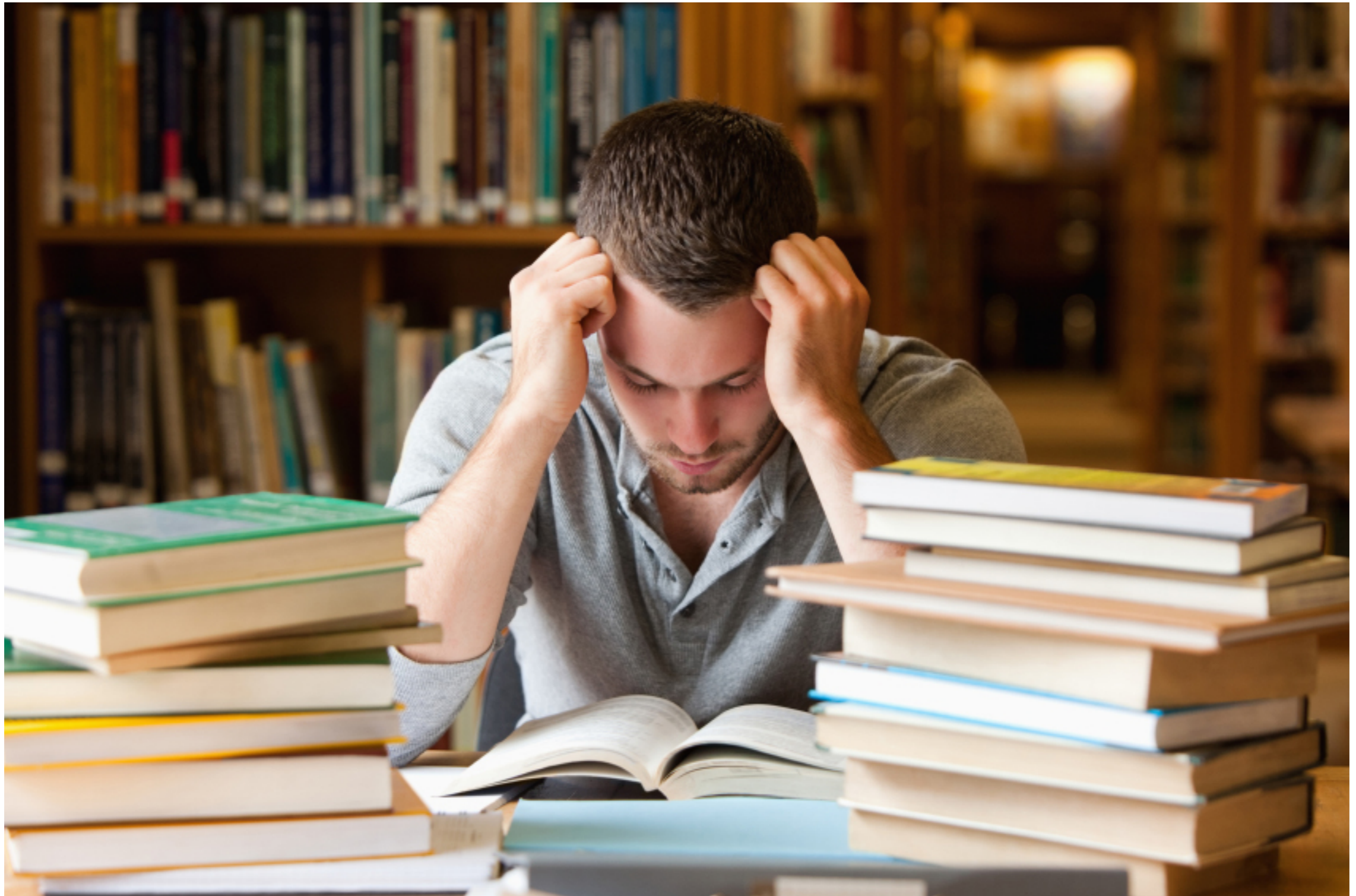

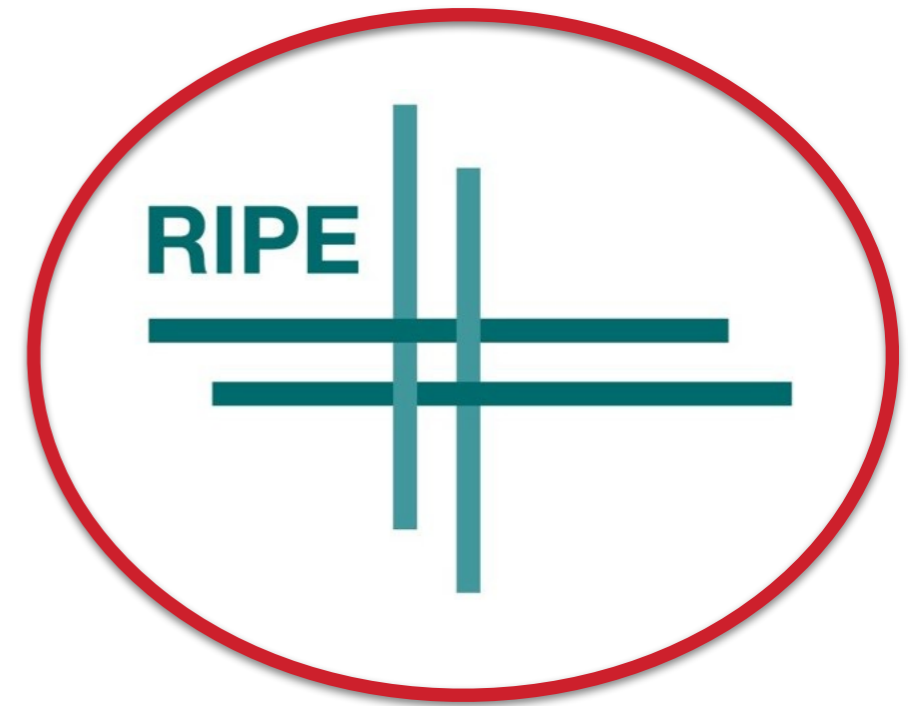

Highly-rated speakers will have a higher chance of being on the programme again (and vice-versa).

You **must have a RIPE NCC Access account** - making one is simple!

Have a Great Idea for a Plenary Presentation?

You can **submit a presentation for the RIPE Meeting Plenary.**

It will be reviewed by the RIPE Programme Committee (PC).

Keep an eye out for the **Call for Presentations** - usually opens **six months before the meeting.**

RIPE Programme Committee

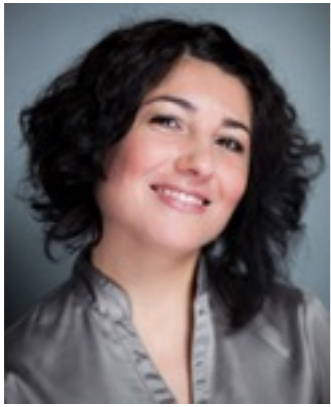
Elected by RIPE Meeting attendees

Check out a BoF

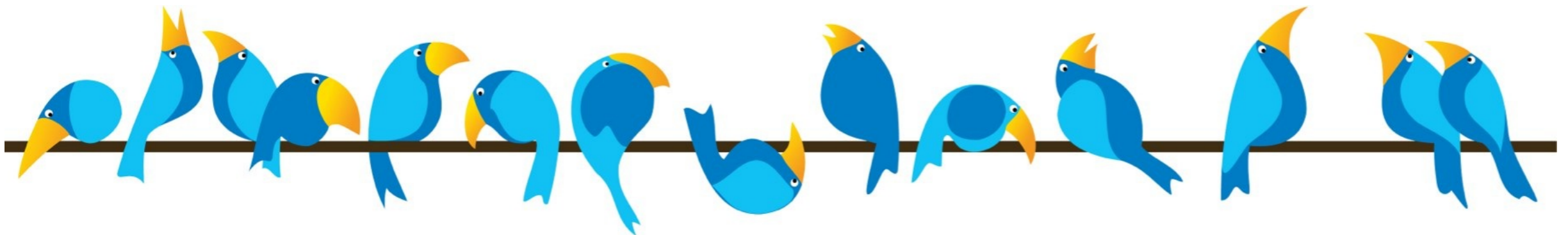
“Birds of a Feather” - **people with the same interests gathering** to talk about a particular topic/issue

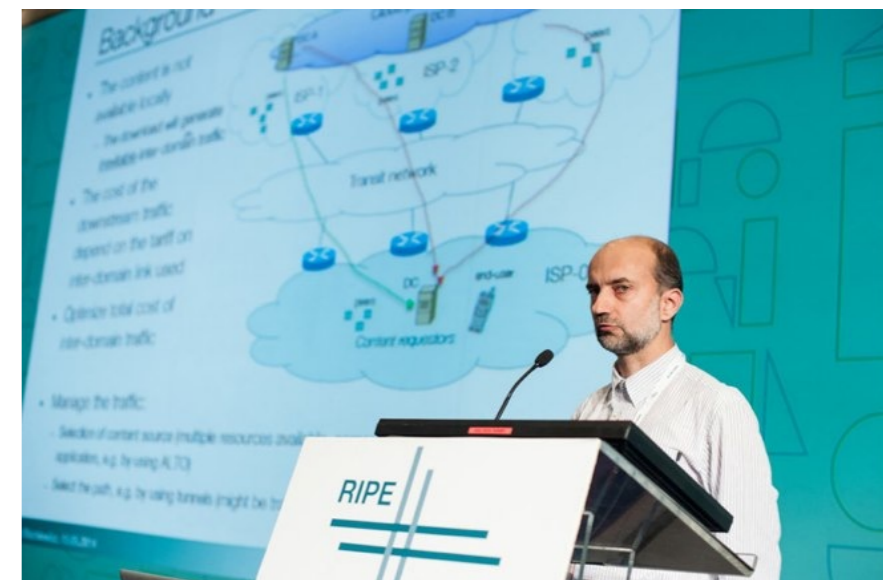
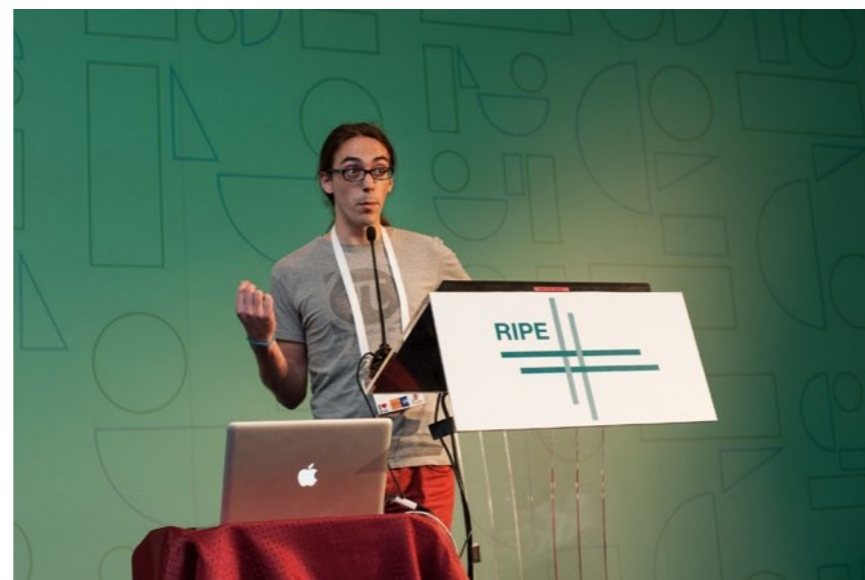

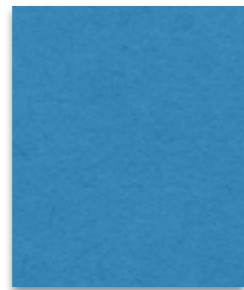
